A Message from the Board Chairman and Executive Director

You will read in the pages of our 2007 Annual Report about our efforts to serve the hungry in Mississippi. We hope that this report will show you how we are accomplishing our mission of creating a hunger-free Mississippi through our programs and our people. Our numbers continue to be impressive. During this last fiscal year we distributed more than 14 million pounds of food and groceries, the equivalent of 11 million meals. Working with America's Second Harvest, The Nation's Food Bank Network, our members, community organizations and hundreds of generous people and businesses, we are making a significant difference in the lives of the people of Mississippi.

As hard as we work to serve the hungry, we know the scope of the task is massive and grows larger every year. According to the federal government's official definition of poverty, 19.3% of the population in Mississippi live below the poverty level. Many of these individuals are employed full time and working every day, but their wages do not provide enough to meet their needs. Against this huge need is the Mississippi Food Network, dedicated to providing assistance in the most far reaching and effective way we can.

Again, with strong community support, we have continued our recent initiative of a fresh produce program whereby we provide nutritious fresh produce to our member agencies. This complements another recent initiative, our anti-obesity programs, which are designed to promote a healthy diet and to educate our clients in the ways of good nutrition. In addition, we continue to have a Mobile Pantry whereby we are able to take the food to the people. In October 2007, Mississippi Food Network was one of seven food banks across the country to be awarded a 14-foot refrigerated truck from actor Paul Newman's salad dressing division. We are very thankful for this gift and it will be used greatly to serve our member agencies. The Board of Directors and our staff are dedicated to a proactive approach and we continue to look for innovative ways to provide better service and improve distribution.

As we celebrate the start of our twenty-fifth year of service, we are always mindful of our mission to relieve poverty-related hunger in our service area by efficiently collecting and distributing wholesome food and through education and advocacy. This annual report tells our story in numbers, words and photographs. As you look it over, remember that each and every one of you plays a role in enabling this organization to provide so much support to so many. Our mission can only be accomplished through the generosity of others. Thank you for all that you do.

Program Highlights

CLUB NUTRITION FOR HEALTHY MINDS AND BODIES

CLUB (Children Learning and Understanding Better) Nutrition is a new nutrition education program being offered to member agencies of Mississippi Food Network. CLUB Nutrition teaches children skills to help them make better choices about the foods they eat – the choice of french fries or baked potato, soda or water, grilled or fried foods. The classes are led by Mississippi Food Network staff Milicent Crosby, Registered Dietician and Cassandra Guess, Program Director.

CLUB Nutrition kicked off on Friday, April 20, 2007, at Crestwood Baptist Church in Jackson. Fifteen children, ages 6-14, participated in the first session and learned about a balanced and healthy lifestyle using the whimsical cast of characters from the OrganWise Guys® that bring to life our internal organs. The OrganWise Guys® which include Hardy Heart®, The Kidney Brothers®, Madame Muscle®, Sir Rebrum® and Peri Stolic® are just some of the characters who are passionate about keeping the children they live in healthy. The lessons focus on low fat, high fiber, lots of water and exercise. During the sessions the children prepare healthy snacks or lunch from fruits and vegetables to help reinforce what they have learned.



CLUB Nutrition sessions will continue to be scheduled with member agencies to reach more children and families with the program.

Program Highlights

SIXTH ANNUAL HUNGER AWARENESS DAY OBSERVED

The face of hunger will surprise you – it can be your neighbor, your co-worker, your church member or others in your community. On Tuesday, June 5, 2007, Mississippi Food Network partnered with Operation Shoestring to help raise awareness about hunger in Mississippi. The children attending the summer enrichment program at Operation Shoestring learned about Mississippi Food Network and their programs. The children also participated in a CLUB Nutrition lesson emphasizing healthier lifestyles and exercise in their own lives.

The day's events also included a Mobile Pantry distribution of fresh apples and oranges for the children to take home. In addition, 50 pre-packaged food boxes were delivered to the Operation Shoestring food pantry to help stock their shelves for the summer months. Operation Shoestring is a member agency of Mississippi Food Network and distributes an average of 40 food boxes each week to families, seniors and disabled people.



FOOD DRIVES HELP PROVIDE FOR HUNGRY MISSISSIPPIANS

Food drives are an important part of Mississippi Food Network's fight to relieve poverty-related hunger in our service area. With the help of groups like the National Association of Letter Carriers, 16-WAPT Food for Families Annual Football Challenge, Nucor Steel, and many other groups, we collected 173,909 pounds of food. This food is used to offer a variety of food items to our member agencies through the self-serve program.

On Saturday, May 12, 2007, the Letter Carriers around the State picked up food for the 15th Annual National Association of Letter Carriers (NALC) Food Drive. This is the largest one-day food drive in the nation and helps collect non-perishable food items for community food banks, pantries and shelters. In 2007, the Letter Carriers in the Jackson area collected 22,215 pounds of food, the equivalent of more than 20,000 meals, for the Mississippi Food Network.

The 14th Annual 16-WAPT Food For Families Football Challenge Food Drive paired up area high schools with their "rivals" on the football field to see how many canned food items they could collect during the week. Over the years, this has become quite a competitive event with the schools to see who can raise the most food items and who will go home with the Challenge trophy. Along with 16-WAPT, St. Dominic Health Services helps sponsor this event by awarding a \$200 donation to the Library Fund of the winning school each week. During the 2006 football season the schools raised a total of 177,003 cans of food with Madison Central raising 97,087 during their week. But winners are based on cans per student so there is always anticipation until the luncheon when the winners are announced. Congratulations to St. Andrews High School for first place with 110 cans, Madison Central with 70.3 cans per student and St. Joseph High School with 38.9 cans per student. Nucor Steel has been hosting a food drive for Mississippi Food Network for several years. They, too, like "friendly" competition as the 258 employees in the various departments compete with each other each year. In November 2006, Nucor Steel donated 7,598 pounds of food which provided more than 6,000 meals.

FRESH PRODUCE INITIATIVE

COOLERS PROVIDED TO MEMBER AGENCIES

On May 3, 2007, thirteen member agencies were presented with a 23 cubic foot cooler to help them increase the distribution of fresh fruit and vegetables to their clients. Through a grant provided from Wal-Mart and America's Second Harvest, Mississippi Food Network purchased the coolers to distribute to member agencies that wanted to expand their fresh produce initiative. All member agencies interested in receiving a cooler were asked to complete an application. A

selection committee reviewed the applications and selected the winning agencies. The member agencies selected were TEAM, Inc., Claiborne County; Bethesda UMC, Copiah County; Catholic Social Community Service, Forrest County; Jackson Revival Center, Hinds County; Helping Hands, Humphreys County; Jasper County Baptist Association, Jasper County; Grace Covenant Church, Jones County; Stephen Chapel MB Church, Lowndes County; Peter's Rock Temple COGIC, Oktibbeha County; Starkville Church of God Compassion Pantry, Oktibbeha County; South Lake Food Pantry, Scott County; Smith County Baptist Association, Smith County; and PBM Ministries, Inc., Wilkinson County.



MOBILE PANTRY DISTRIBUTES FRESH FRUITS AND VEGETABLES

As part of our healthy initiative to help distribute more fresh fruits and vegetables to the clients served by our member agencies, we continued the Mobile Pantry. The Mobile Pantry visited member agencies on their regular distribution days to help supplement the food the clients are picking up with fresh produce. 10,610 pounds of fresh produce, including apples, bananas, potatoes, sweet potatoes and more, was distributed this year. It was a great success distributing fresh fruits and vegetables to people who often cannot afford or do not have access to fresh produce. In addition, we distribute literature with health facts, recipes, and other information about the fresh fruits and vegetables.

ANOTHER BUSY YEAR AS THE WORK CONTINUES

Mississippi Food Network had another busy year distributing 14,105,706 pounds of food through our member agencies operating food pantries, soup kitchens, day care centers, CSFP programs and more. The Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP) accounted for a total of 3,440,988 pounds during the year through the distribution of 6,600 senior citizen boxes and 400 boxes for 5 year-old children each month. In addition, we distributed 7,160,275 pounds through The Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP). We continued with the fresh produce initiative adopted last year and distributed a total of 742,689 pounds of fresh fruits and vegetables through the warehouse and the Mobile Pantry.

A total of 1,056,666 people were served during the year through our 320 member agencies. We averaged 88,056 people being served each month which was a significant increase from the previous year. The population of people served was a good mix with 20% being senior citizens over the age of 60. 27% of those served are 19-40 years of age and the 41-60 years of age group accounted for 26%. 27% of those served were children under the age of 18.

With the purchase of a new tractor and the trailer donated last year, we continued our rural truck route with the 16 drop off points within the state where member agencies meet to pick up their orders. The other agencies continued to pick up their orders from the warehouse in Jackson.
