A Message from the Board Chairman and Executive Director

On behalf of the Board of Directors and staff of the Mississippi Food Network, Mississippi's Food Bank, we are pleased to provide you with our 2007-2008 Annual Report. Working with Feeding America, formerly America's Second Harvest, our member agencies, volunteers, community organizations and hundreds of generous people and businesses, we are making a significant difference in the lives of the people of Mississippi. We hope this report will show you the extent of our efforts to serve the hungry and to accomplish our mission of creating a hunger-free Mississippi through our programs and our people here at the Mississippi Food Network.

The scope of this task is massive and grows larger every year. Almost twenty percent of the population in Mississippi lives below the federal poverty level. Many of these individuals are employed full time and work every day, but their wages do not provide enough to meet their needs and now in our current economy, more people have lost their jobs and are unable to provide for their families. Accordingly, many more are being put in the position of asking their local pantries for help to feed their families each month. The Mississippi Food Network and our member agencies are dedicated to providing effective and far-reaching assistance to these families. The Board of Directors and our staff are dedicated to a proactive approach and we continue to look for innovative ways to provide better service.

During 2007 - 2008, our numbers were impressive. We distributed more than 12 million pounds of food and groceries, the equivalent of more than nine million meals to our member agencies. With continuing community and national support, we have expanded our initiative to provide fresh nutritious produce to our member agencies at nominal or no cost. In addition, we continue to expand our child feeding programs through the Kids Cafe and Backpack programs. We are very thankful for this generous gift and the support of all of our donors.

As we celebrate our twenty-fifth year of service, we are always mindful of our mission to relieve poverty-related hunger by efficiently collecting and distributing wholesome food as well as through education and advocacy. As you look over this Annual Report, remember that each and every one of you plays a role in enabling this organization to provide so much support to so many. Our mission can only be accomplished through the generosity of others. Thank you for all that you do.

VOLUNTEERS

Volunteers continue to be an important part of Mississippi Food Network. This year we have been very fortunate to have a variety of people volunteering and helping us. Blue Cross Blue Shield employees have helped pack Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP) boxes. Each month we look forward to returning workers and new workers. Thank you Blue Cross Blue Shield employees.

In addition, each year the Hugh O'Brien Youth Leadership (HOBY) kids come back to volunteer. Each year during their leadership weekend, these 10th grade high school students are going to various non-profit organizations to volunteer their time. It is a pleasure having these young people come back each year. The Emerging Leaders Student Institute (ELSI) also participated in volunteer activities this year. These students participate in a week long leadership training program at Hinds Community College Utica Campus each year. Each of the students participating hold a 3.0 grade point average and are selected by their schools to participate. This was the first year for these students to volunteer and we hope they will come back again next year.

The Phi Theta Kappa students from CoLin Community College also spent time volunteering at the Mississippi Food Network this year. This was part of their officer leadership training.

Program Highlights

CHILDREN'S PROGRAMS

Kids' Cafe

On September 10, 2007, Mississippi Food Network opened their first Kids Cafe at the Boys & Girls Club of Washington County. Kids Cafe programs provide free meals and snacks to low-income children through a variety of existing community locations where children congregate such as Boys & Girls Clubs, churches or public schools. In addition to providing meals to hungry kids, all Kids Cafe programs also offer a safe place, where under the supervision of trustworthy staff, a child can get involved in educational, recreational and social activities that draw on existing community programs and often include family members.

The opportunity to open the Kids Cafe was made possible through a grant from Uncle Ben's Rice/Mars Food. Mississippi Food Network opened the first Uncle Ben's Kids Cafe in the country. The Boys & Girls Club of Washington County was chosen because the Uncle Ben's plant



in Greenville had adopted the Club. Each day during the school year, 50 children attending the programs at the Club are served a hot, nutritious meal before they leave each afternoon. In addition, they have homework help and other programs each afternoon and have a nutrition lesson once a month.

During the summer months, Mississippi Food Network participated in the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) through the State Department of Education. The SFSP program began on June 2, 2008 and ran through July 31, 2008 at the Kids Cafe in Greenville. Each day 120 children

attending the Boys & Girls Club received breakfast and lunch through this program. The Kids Cafe continues to run during the school year providing children a meal each afternoon before they go home.

BackPack Program

Mississippi's first BackPack program was started on June 5, 2008 at Stewpot Community Services. This BackPack program is funded by the Charity Projects Entertainment Fund (CPEF) "Idol Gives Back" campaign. This program distributed over 1,000 backpacks during the summer program.

Mississippi Food Network provides a backpack each week filled with healthy food items that are packaged in "kid friendly" packaging. The purpose of the BackPack program is to fill the gap that is left when children are not in school and have access to the Free and Reduced School feeding program - over a weekend or school holiday. This program is targeted to children at risk for hunger and the backpacks are distributed in a discreet and caring manner.



Program Highlights

New Truck Added To Fleet

Through a grant from Feeding America, formerly America's Second Harvest, Ford Motor Company, and Newman's Own Foundation, Mississippi Food Network was selected as a recipient of a new 14 foot refrigerated truck. The truck was presented to Executive Director Walker Satterwhite at the 2008 National Conference. The truck is primarily used for food drive and store donation pickups, Kids Cafe and Backpack Program deliveries, and Mobile Pantry distributions for fresh produce.



Partnerships Play Integral Role In Programs and Services

Partnerships are a very important part of the programs and services we provide our member agencies and their clients. This year we have formed a new partnership with the USM Dietetic Intern program. For several years the students have toured the Mississippi Food Network as part of their program rotation. However, this year we have taken it one step further with the Interns now doing their special interest rotation with the Mississippi Food Network. They will be working with the CLUB Nutrition, Kids Cafe and BackPack program, in addition to the CSFP program for our senior citizens. The interns have taught nutrition classes, provided recipes for senior citizens based on their CSFP boxes contents, and held food demonstrations. We are very excited about this new partnership and look forward to a continued relationship.

In addition, we teamed up with the "Committee of 19" from Mississippi State University. The "Committee of 19" campus organization partnered with the **Students Team Up To Fight Hunger (STUFH www.stufh.org)** to conduct a food drive the last week of classes and collected more than 1,500 pounds of food. In addition, the "Committee of 19" worked with the Society of St. Andrews and helped bag gleaned sweet potatoes that were then distributed by Mississippi Food Network.

Ameristar Announced As 2007 Hunger's Hero Recipient

Each year Mississippi Food Network awards the Hunger's Hero Award to an organization and/or individual in recognition of their leadership in the Network's effort to alleviate hunger in our State. The Hunger's Hero Award is the highest honor the Mississippi Food Network can bestow in our fight against hunger. The 2007 Hunger's Hero Award was awarded to the Team Members of the Ameristar Casino in Vicksburg. The Team Members donate to the Mississippi Food Network through their Ameristar Cares Workplace Giving Campaign through a payroll deduction plan. The Ameristar Foundation then matches dollar for dollar the money raised by the employees each year. We appreciate the generosity and commitment of the Ameristar Team Members to Mississippi Food Network.
